Programs & Accomplishments:

In 2021 Youth Farm continued to work through new challenges and opportunities, and maintained safety and equity as our top priorities. Throughout the year, we continued to work with young people through employment programs, school partnerships, community engagement, and plant/food distribution. Our progressive program model remained central to our youth development work. Through this model, youth work together while finding challenging and age-appropriate opportunities as they mature, including:

YOUTH FARMERS (AGE 9-11) & ALL STARS (AGE 12-13): Youth Farmers and All Stars participate in farm, food, and cooking classes, learning to hone their gardening and cooking skills while becoming role models, working within the food system, and making decisions regarding programming and food distribution. Work with Youth Farmers and All-Stars was limited due to Covid-19 restrictions in schools and across our communities, but connections were maintained virtually through school partnerships and staff outreach. Additionally, a small group helped Youth Farm's Project LEAD and Farm Steward team plant, maintain, and harvest the Nellie Stone Johnson Farm in North Minneapolis.

PROJECT LEAD (AGE 14-18): Project LEAD participants take on part-time employment in which their role is to lead programming for younger youth, assist with farm design, and co-host community events. In 2021, the Project LEAD team was integral in managing garden spaces, harvesting produce, and distributing plants and food. Additionally, they participated in virtual meetings, cookalongs, and mini projects.

FARM STEWARDS (AGE 19-24): Farm Stewards participate in employment opportunities and take on the leadership of overall farm and program design. They also serve as mentors to younger youth and community connectors between Youth Farm and local businesses, schools, and organizations. During the 2021 growing season, Farm Stewards managed garden spaces and partnerships, even among shifting safety procedures. Additionally, Farm Stewards used distanced time to produce a new Youth Farm greenhouse catalog that streamlined seed orders for the 2022 growing season.

Outcomes & Significant Events:

In 2021, we continued to work in ways that focused on flexibility and and maintaining connections with Youth Farmers in new ways. Because all of our partner schools in both Minneapolis and St. Paul were in distance learning for the majority of the year, our staff connected throughout the school year virtually and supported programming for teachers. Additionally, during the growing season, we grew over 15,000 plant starts in our greenhouse for Youth Farm gardens and farms, school partners, and other community partners.

Throughout the continued challenges that 2021 brought, we did not stray from our mission and kept our focus on the needs of youth and community. Our youth and staff leadership in both North Minneapolis and across St. Paul worked to develop and organize around two large scale projects for Youth Farm's future, the Northside Youth Greenhouse in North Minneapolis, and the Space and Place Project in St. Paul. These projects will guide our work in the coming 5-10 years across Youth Farm.
